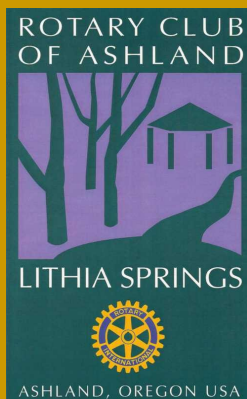
THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
